

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

- What priorities and accountability for ODA allocations?









IDEAS FOR ACTION

KEY OBSTACLES TO IMPLEMENTING POLICY COHERENCE FOR SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT:

Lack of long-term measures to ensure sustained commitment beyond electoral cycles

→Limited enforceability measures

Challenges in communicating the benefits across government

Absence of defined priority areas, time-bound actions or key performance indicators
